Dr. Kane is a fellow at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs, Managing the Atom Project. Her concentration is on international law, nuclear nonproliferation, weapons of mass destruction, and terrorism.

***Hooshang Amirahmadi, Speaker***

School of Planning and Public Policy, Rutgers University

Dr. Amirahmadi is a professor of Planning and Public Policy, and director of the Center for Middle Eastern Studies, and founder and president of the American Iranian Council, a policy think tank devoted to improving understanding between the peoples and governments of Iran and the United States.

Boston University, Department of International Relations

Charles Dunbar teaches U.S. Foreign Policy, Middle Eastern political economy, Muslim and Western world Relations, and the United Nations peacekeeping. Before coming to Boston, he spent 33 years as an American and United Nations diplomat and worked in the Middle East for 21 years, including four in Iran.
